ORDINANCE NO. 2218-18-78

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 18.24.020 A AND B OF CHAPTER 18.24 OF TITLE 18 OF ORDINANCE IN REVISION NO. 850, COMMONLY KNOWN AS THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE CITY OF HURON, SOUTH DAKOTA, PERTAINING TO BUILDING REGULATIONS – AIR CONDITIONING AND REFRIGERATION.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF CITY COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF HURON, SOUTH DAKOTA:

That Section 18.24.020 A and B of Chapter 18.24 of Title 18 of Ordinance in Revision No. 850 be amended to read as follows:

18.24.020 - Regulations.

It is unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to have installed or to operate air conditioning or refrigeration equipment without first conforming to the following regulations:

- A. PERMIT. All water customers who desire to install water utilizing air conditioning or refrigeration equipment are required to submit an application for approval of their equipment and obtain a permit therefor in advance from the city finance officer and are required to give notice of completion of such installation to the city water service department. The permit charge shall be set by resolution of the governing board.
- B. WATER FROM CITY MAINS. All compressor types of air conditioning and refrigeration units having standard rated capacities of less than three tons, may be equipped with water-cooled condensers, using water from city mains, provided that not more than one such unit of such capacity and so equipped or combination of units of such total capacity, whether connected singly, in series or in parallel may be used in one air conditioning or refrigeration system. All water from city mains shall be metered.
