Frequently Asked Questions

Northern State University Master's in Education Degree Offered at Huron Community Campus



- Do the classes meet face-to-face or on-line?
Although there will be an on-line component with some classes, it will be necessary to attend class in Huron.
- How will the schedule be created?
The enrolled students will help determine future schedules. For Fall 2014 (the initial semester) students will meet one weekend day per month per class. Students enrolled in six credit hours (two classes) should plan on a consecutive Saturday/Sunday schedule each month. The first two fall classes are currently scheduled to meet Saturday, September 20 and Sunday, September 21. Students will meet a total of five days for each class per semester.
- How many credits would one take each semester and over the summer to complete the program in two years?
Students will take six credits each every fall and spring. In order to complete the program within two years, there will be a summer component as well.
- How do I find a list of courses needed to complete the degree?
Go to our [class schedule](#) on our website. The specific schedules for each semester will be decided by students, administration, and faculty.
- Up to nine credits can be transferred to the program. Is there a list of credits that would be accepted?
NSU would need your transcripts to transfer credits. It is our understanding that any graduate degree credits in education would transfer.
- Do students need to pay the money up front for the program, or pay on a credit by credit basis?
Students pay every semester. Eligible students can apply for and receive federal financial aid.
- How soon should students apply for admission as there is a limit of 30 spots?
We recommend you apply ASAP. A completed admissions file is not needed to begin taking classes, but NSU will need a completed [application for admission](#) sent to the address listed on the form.
