

Downloading eBooks from South Dakota Titles to Go

Overdrive and Libby are two separate apps for reading eBooks from the library. They are from the same company and work the same way, they just look a bit different.

Libby is compatible with Android, iOS devices, and Kindle Paperwhites. Libby is great if you just want to download a book to your Android or iOS phone or tablet.

Overdrive is the “classic” app, and is compatible with more devices, including Kindle Fire, Macs, PCs, and Windows mobile devices. It also allows for transfer to MP3 players from computers.

If you use one iOS or Android device to browse, download, and read or listen to digital books, try Libby.

If you like to read books on many devices, or prefer to browse for new titles on your computer, stick with the Overdrive app for now.

Set up for iPad and iPhone

1. Choose either Overdrive: eBooks or audio books or Libby by Overdrive from your APP Store. They are free to use. Enter your APP store ID and download it to your device.
2. Open the app on your device and sign in using your library card number and password. You may have to call your library for that information. In most libraries (including the Huron Public Library), the password is your last name in all capital letters.
3. Choose your library from the list (South Dakota Digital Consortium, then Huron Public Library).
4. You will then see a screen where you can browse the titles shown, or use the magnifying glass to search for a specific title or author.
5. Click on the cover of the book to see more information.
6. If the book available it will say “Borrow” under the picture of the book cover. If it is already checked out it will say “Place on Hold”. When you place it on hold, you will be notified when the book becomes available.
7. An open book icon means the book is in a format to read. The headphones icon means it is an audio book.
8. Click “Borrow” to select the book. The app may ask if you want to read it as an EPUB eBook or Read Now with Kindle. Choose EPUB unless you are actually using a Kindle.
9. The book will automatically download to your device. Once it is downloaded, you can read it on your device at anytime, anywhere, without being connected to Wi-Fi.

10. To read the book, click on the three bars in the top left corner of the screen. This will open the Home menu where you can select "Bookshelf". All of the books you downloaded will appear on your bookshelf. Select the title you want to read and it will open. You can stop reading at any time and the app will save your place.
11. You can borrow up to five books at a time. The standard checkout time is two weeks. In Libby you cannot change the length of the checkout time.
12. Titles will disappear when the due date is reached. If you want to return the book early, go to the three bars in the upper left corner, click on Bookshelf, click and hold the title until the message comes up then click Return to Library.

For Kindle

1. Follow steps 1-7 under iPad and iPhone
2. When you get to the step to "Borrow" choose "Read Now with Kindle"
3. The app will then forward you to Amazon. Kindles cannot read the format that EPUBs are created in. The book has to be transferred to Amazon so it can be converted to a format that Kindles can read.
4. Sign into your Amazon account.
5. Go to your account page and in the list with your order history etc., click on "My content and devices"
6. There should be a button that says "Get Library Book", click that and it will say deliver to your Kindle or other device, choose Kindle.
7. Amazon then sends the book to your Kindle in a format you can read.
8. To return the book early, you need to go into your Amazon account, to content and devices, and select the book title and click return it now.
9. Again, you can have up to 5 books for a two-week period.
